A LITTLE THOUGHT ON REPENTANCE

Repentance is the activity of reviewing one's actions and feeling contrition or regret for past wrongs, which is accompanied by commitment to change for the better. Other words to describe repentance are: Sorrow, regret, pricked conscience, remorse.

Repentance means to 'clean up your act'. It may also stand for repair, reconciliation, restitution. It is the admission of faults, acknowledgement of wrong doing and taking proper precautions or seeking help to ensure that similar situations doesn't arise.

(Ephesians 2:8) For by grace you have been saved through faith and that not of yourselves it is the gift of God





My name is Temilolu Agbede. I came into the UK September 2015 for a masters program in Electronics and electrical engineering with Management.

When I came, I really didn't have any plans to stay back but I was very open minded.

One of the first things I discovered in my school was that most of the masters' students moved in clusters typically according to the countries we were all from especially the Chinese students. We (Nigerians) did not collaborate as such so you had to find your 'tribe' yourself, so I started mixing up with people from different countries as well as Nigerian students. In the process, the closest people to me (my tribe) were an Indian and a Pakistani.

I also had the habit of reading through my mails (no matter what it was). One day we were in the library to study when I came across a mail that talked about an entrepreneurship competition called social storm and that it was open to everyone, I showed my tribe and we registered.

Participating in the competition helped us to also know that there were other activities going on in school that we never really knew about and could be a part of.

At this point, I would say this: look for any free event, workshop or activity in and out of school that fuels your career path or interests and go for them. Start with free events first before deciding to pay for any event if you can afford it and think it is worth it. It was in one of these sessions that I knew that the graduate enterprise visa existed!

So I did my due diligence and researched about the visa online and also asked what to do from the students in the enterprise activities I had been to and had been acquainted with at the time. They directed me to book an appointment with the enterprise manager to discuss my ideas with her. I did that. I finally got the visa to run a business in the UK.

In summary, it is always great to read through all your student mails. Many opportunities are hidden in many of them. Mix up with everyone to help better your understanding of the environment. Don't just stick with the people from your country or continent unless your collaboration is efficient. Never be scared to ask questions. At the end of the day, all the lines will fall in pleasant places for you.
