Decide early in life what your boundaries are and make them consistent with godliness and contentment which is great gain.



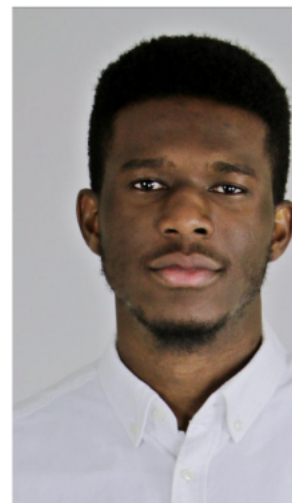
Seek for Godly counsel when you are under pressure and stop blaming other people for your issues in life.
